December 9, Nancy Carlson, Children's Author/Illustrator "The World of Picture Books"



Nancy Carlson has written and illustrated more than 64 children's books since 1979. She first decided to become an illustrator as a young child growing up in Edina, MN. She drew for hours, telling stories through her drawings. Graduating from the Minneapolis College of Art, Nancy worked as an illustrator. While there, her editor suggested

she try writing her own stories. Her first book, *Harriet's Recital*, launched an entire neighborhood of delightful characters to help young readers deal with everyday situations and learn basic values, such as honesty, self-confidence, and determination. Nancy's specialty is teaching kids to feel good about themselves and others. Publishers Weekly wrote of her book, *I Like Me!*, "The foundation of a

healthy self-image, the cornerstone of a happy and successful life, is what Carlson's work is all about."

Nancy finds inspiration from her family, friends, pets, and past experiences. She loves nature and outdoor recreation.

Over the years, in addition to books, she has written stage plays and designed specialty items, such as posters, t-shirts, caps, and greeting cards.

On Monday, December 9th, Nancy Carlson will share with the Guild her journey in writing picture books. Along the way she will cover where ideas come from, the picture book structure, and her experiences, both good and bad, in the book business.

Literary Holiday Treat

What is Christmas without gingerbread? For your literary pleasure, you might try this recipe by American poet, Emily Dickinson, born on December 10, 1830. She lived until May 15, 1886. Known as one of the greatest poets in American history, within her community Dickinson was acknowledged and appreciated as an accomplished cook. Here is her recipe as transcribed from her original manuscript in *Emily Dickinson: Profile of the Poet as Cook* *:

1 quart flour 1 teaspoon soda 1/2 cup butter 1 teaspoon salt 1/2 cup cream Make up with

1 tablespoon ginger molasses

The editors of the book add the following about Emily Dickinson's gingerbread recipe:

"Cream the butter and mix with lightly whipped cream. Sift dry ingredients together

and combine with other ingredients. The dough is stiff and needs to be pressed into whatever pan you choose. A round or small square pan is suitable. The recipe also fits perfectly into a cast iron muffin pan, if you happen to have one which makes oval cakes. Bake at 350 degrees Fahrenheit for 20-25 minutes."

Take time from busy schedules to read God's Word aloud, to listen to the wisdom, the themes, and the story. Allow the truth and message to enlarge your vision and writing mission.




Read with children.
