2015 Annual Writing Contest GUIDELINES: Magazine Article Highlighting Relationships

Relationships impact every part of our lives. Write a magazine article that brings some type of relationship to light.

Requirements—Article must:

- be from a Christian perspective or worldview.
- in some way highlight relationships, whether with God or other people, in any aspect of life.
- be written for a magazine. Target audience and target magazine publication should be indicated at the top left of the manuscript on page one.
- be typed, double-spaced, and be previously unpublished.
- include a title.
- be between 600-900 words. Word count must appear at the top left of the manuscript on page one.
- include an unattached **cover sheet** with your name, address, phone number, email, and title of article. Do not include name or contact information on the manuscript itself. This retains confidentiality during the judging process.

Guidelines for magazine article entries:

Entry deadline: Monday, April 13, 2015 at 9:00 p.m. (end of the Guild meeting).

All entrants must be members of the MCWG.

Submit entry article and **\$5 entry fee** in an envelope, in person or by mail, to Lotis Key-Kabigting, 1586 Sussex Drive, Minnetonka, MN 55345.

Winners will be announced and prizes awarded at the May 11, 2015 MCWG meeting.

1st Prize = \$100; 2nd Prize = \$75; 3rd Prize = \$50

Manuscripts accompanied by a self-addressed stamped envelope will be returned. The decision of the judge is final. The judge will remain anonymous.

From our theme verse in Romans 15:4-6, endurance and encouragement from God and a "spirit of unity among yourselves" come through following Christ Jesus.
