

3 Online Tools You Can Benefit From Today

If we truly want to take our writing to the next level, there are countless tools we can utilize to our advantage. In fact, I use a number of tools that help me remain focused on my writing, and these tools will help you remain focused as well. Think through the last chapter you wrote. You have probably used Microsoft's grammar check. It's simple and it works, for most cases. However, there's one app that blows them all out of the water. That app; grammarly.com.



Forbes Magazine calls it the “*gold standard*” and “*makes your writing better*.” If you want to take your writing to the next level, Grammarly will help eliminate any errors that slow down your text. Most of the errors you encounter, Microsoft Word won't even find. This is where Grammarly comes in handy. It automatically tells you when you have an error.



Grammarly is *free* and will find most errors. If you want any advanced features it's around \$12/month, if you pay monthly. You can also add a *free* extension to Google Chrome. The best part about this plugin, if you're writing your blog post, Grammarly will help you along the way. This way, you won't have to leave your window, and can focus on your writing.

If you've been around the Guild for any length of time, or have purchased any writing books, you'll soon discover that authors love talking about mind mapping and outlining their books. I've tried using Microsoft Word for outlining and find it cumbersome to use, especially if I want to change anything. I've used Scrivener, which is a big improvement but it lacks that true, blue outline format.

Enter Workflowy. This app is available on any browser, Android, or Apple iOS. Here's


